AGF Systematic Global Multi-Sector Bond ETF

March 31, 2023

Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of fund performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the fund's performance and outlook.

Results of Operations

For the six months ended March 31, 2023, AGF Systematic Global Multi-Sector Bond ETF (formerly, AGFiQ Global Multi-Sector Bond ETF) (the "Fund") returned 4.9% (net of expenses) while the Blended Benchmark returned 5.0%. The Blended Benchmark is composed of 50% Bloomberg Global Treasury Index (hedged to CAD)/50% Bloomberg US Corporate Investment Grade Index (hedged to CAD).

The Fund slightly under-performed the Blended Benchmark. Within investment grade bonds, carry was the best factor, while value and quality lagged. Carry is the difference between the yield on a longer maturity bond and the cost of borrowing. High quality under-performed significantly during the first five months of the reporting period, but out-performed in March 2023 during the risk-off market and provided protections among regional bank selloffs. When the market sentiment is 'risk-off,' there is pessimism in the market and market participants favour lower risk investments.

From a sector perspective, selection within Information Technology and Consumer Discretionary added value to the Fund within the investment grade universe, while selection within Financials and an underweight to Communication Services detracted.

Within the Fund's sovereign bond universe, quality was the best performing factor, while momentum lagged. From a geographic perspective, selection within Western Europe added value to the Fund due to defensive positioning within the region, while selection within Asia Pacific detracted.

Over the reporting period, the Fund reduced its allocations to low quality high yield category with more focus on BB-rated companies and continued to add investment grade bonds with attractive valuation and reduce cyclical exposures within industrial sectors.

The Fund entered into foreign exchange forward contracts during the period under review. As of March 31, 2023, the Fund was long Canadian dollar and short Australian dollar, Chinese Yuan Renminbi, Euro, Pound Sterling, Japanese Yen, Mexican Peso and U.S. dollar in order to hedge its currency exposure.

The Fund had net subscriptions of approximately \$3 million for the current period, as compared to net subscriptions of approximately \$14 million in the prior period. Rebalancing by institutional programs resulted in net subscriptions of approximately \$3 million in the Fund. The portfolio manager does not believe that subscription activity had a meaningful impact on the Fund's performance or the ability to implement its investment strategy.

Recent Developments

Bond markets remained volatile over the reporting period, driven by variable economic data, the banking system turmoil that arose in March 2023, central bank policies and the markets' reaction to them. Inflation levels broadly moderated but remained elevated versus target levels, and resilient economic activity also supported further central bank rate hikes, albeit at a more moderate pace. In recognition of the decelerating pace of inflation and growth, as well as the fact that monetary policy acts with a long and variable lag, the Bank of Canada elected to pause its rate hike campaign after raising rates in October 2022, December 2022 and January 2023. The U.S. Federal Reserve (the "Fed") and European Central Bank's tightening cycles continued at a slower pace in an effort to contain elevated inflation while striving to avoid too hard an impact on economic activity through braking too aggressively. The U.S. dollar declined over the reporting period and Fed Chairman Jerome Powell cautioned that taming inflation might take longer than previously anticipated. Elsewhere, China's long-awaited economic rebound helped the global economic outlook somewhat after the country abandoned its zero-COVID policy. As Russia's invasion of Ukraine passed the one-year mark, NATO member nations pledged their unwavering support to Ukraine.

The U.S. economy grew 2.6% in the last calendar quarter of 2022, fueled by an increase in inventory investment and consumer spending, partly offset by a decline in housing investment. In January 2023, the unemployment rate hit a 50-year low of 3.4% and moved up to 3.6% in February. Inflation fell to 6.0% year on year in February 2023, the lowest since September 2021.

Bond prices were lower in February 2023 due to strong global economic data, prompting comments from the Fed pushing back on market expectations of cuts later in the year. These moves reversed most of the previous gains made over the reporting period. However, the bond market rally resumed in March 2023 as news of bank failures hit the headlines and reinforced the narrative of this tightening cycle nearing an end. The Fed still raised the federal funds rate by 0.25% to a range of 4.75% to 5.00% in March 2023, pushing borrowing costs to the highest since 2007. Consumer sentiment fell for the first time in four months to 63.4 in March 2023 from 67.0

in February 2023, which was the highest since January 2022. Consumer sentiment is an economic indicator that measures how optimistic consumers feel about their finances and the state of the economy. In March 2023, the central bank noted that the U.S. banking sector is resilient despite recent developments surrounding SVB Financial Group and other regional banks. These developments are likely to result in tighter credit conditions and could weigh on economic activity.

The global economic outlook remains somewhat resilient despite the significant amount of tightening that has occurred so far. Inflation has remained sticky and although it may continue to decelerate in the coming months, it is likely to remain above-target and keep central banks vigilant. As a result, the bar remains quite high for central banks to cut interest rates in 2023 unless the growth profile deteriorates significantly. Many developed market yield curves have been substantially inverted for some time, another leading indicator of slowing economic growth. Given the likely prospects of slower economic growth going forward, the portfolio manager continues to remain defensive from a credit perspective. Furthermore, the portfolio manager continues to focus on carry and value opportunities as yield remains higher than what has been seen in recent years resulting in a more attractive income profile for the Fund without taking excessive credit risk.

Related Party Transactions

AGF Investments Inc. ("AGFI") is the manager ("Manager"), trustee and promoter of the Fund and is responsible for the day-to-day business of the Fund. AGFI also acts as the investment (portfolio) manager, managing the investment portfolio of the Fund. AGFI entered into an investment sub-advisory agreement with AGF Investments LLC, which acts as a sub-advisor and provides investment sub-advisory services to the Fund. Under the Declaration of Trust, the Fund pays management fees (including fees for sub-advisory services), calculated based on the Net Asset Value of the Fund. Management fees of approximately \$250,000 were incurred by the Fund during the six months ended March 31, 2023.

AGFI and AGF Investments LLC are indirect wholly-owned subsidiaries of AGF Management Limited.

Explanatory Notes

(1) a) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements and unaudited interim financial statements. Under International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"), investments that are traded in an active market are generally valued at closing price, which is determined to be within the bid-ask spread and most representative of fair value. As a result, there is no difference between the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements ("Net Assets") and the net asset value per unit calculated for fund pricing purposes ("Net Asset Value").

b) The Fund commenced operations in October 2018, which represents the date upon which securities were first made available for purchase by investors.

(2) Net Assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.

(3) Distributions were paid in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both. The characterization of the distributions is based on management's estimate of the actual income for the year.

(4) This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending Net Assets per unit.

(5) The management expense ratio ("MER") is calculated in accordance with National Instrument 81-106, based on all the expenses of the Fund (including Harmonized Sales Tax, Goods and Services Tax and interest, but excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) and the Fund's proportionate share of the MER, if applicable, of the underlying funds and exchange traded funds ("ETFs") in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.

(6) AGFI waived certain fees or absorbed certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined annually at the discretion of AGFI and AGFI can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.

(7) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, including the Fund's proportionate share of the commissions, if applicable, of the underlying funds and ETFs in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.

(8) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's PTR in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

PTR is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding short-term investments.

(9) Closing market price on the last trading day of the period, as applicable, as reported on the NEO Exchange. Mid price is disclosed if no transaction took place on the last business day of the period.

Management Fees

The Fund is managed by AGFI. AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Fund, which include providing investment and management services as well as other administrative services required by the Fund. As compensation for such services, AGFI receives a monthly management fee (including fees for sub-advisory services) at the annual rate of 0.45%, which includes applicable taxes, based on the Net Asset Value of the Fund, calculated daily and payable monthly. AGFI bears all operating expenses of the Fund except for management fees, brokerage expenses and commissions, costs associated with the use of derivatives (if applicable), income and withholding taxes as well as all other applicable taxes, costs of complying with any new governmental or regulatory requirement introduced

after the Fund was established, costs associated with the establishment and on-going operation of the Independent Review Committee, and extraordinary expenses.

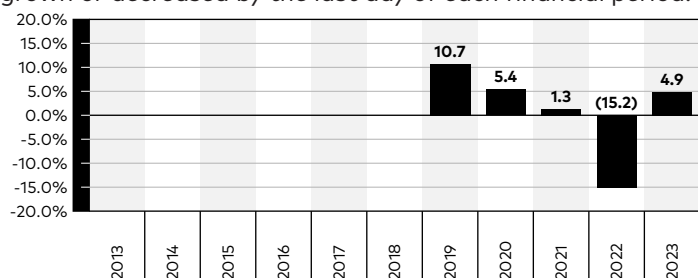
Past Performance*
